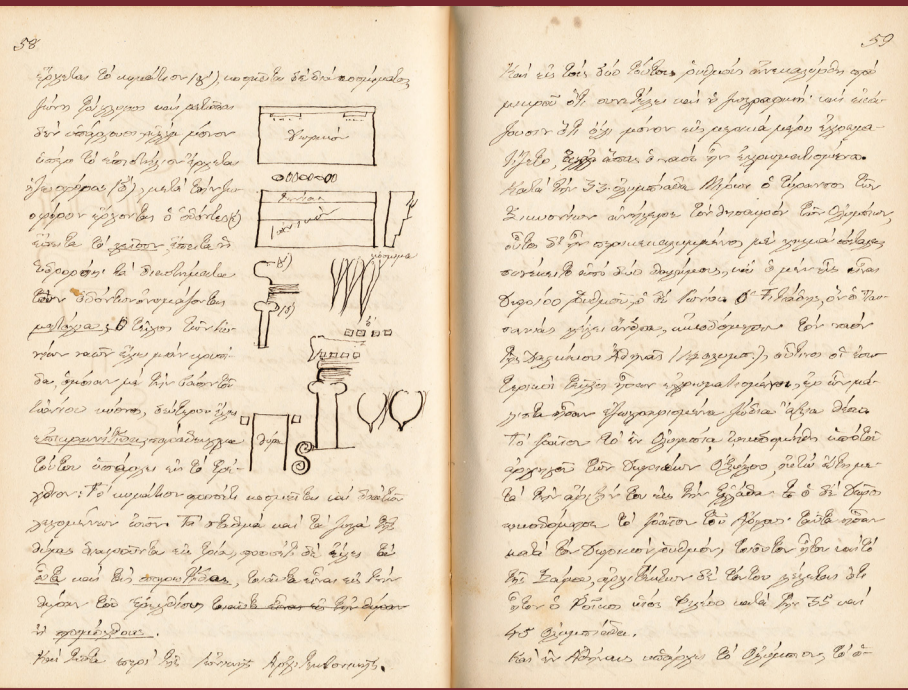

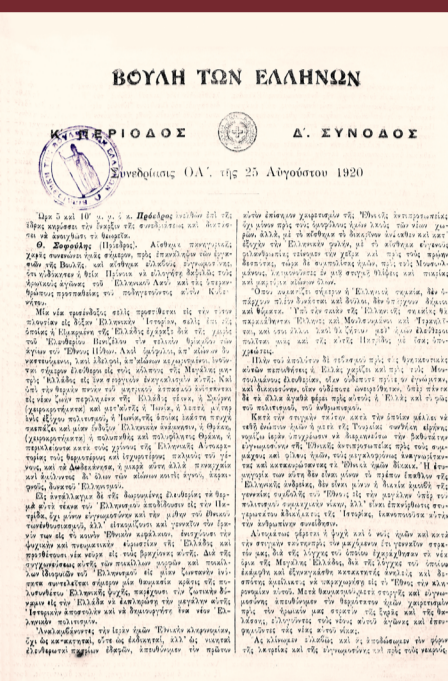

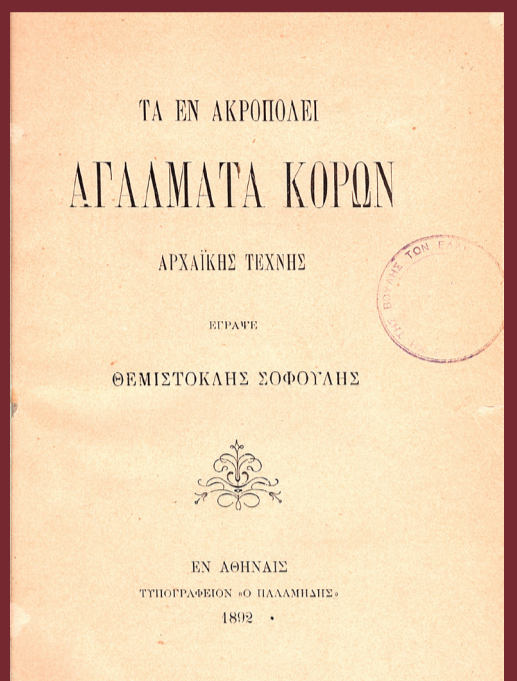

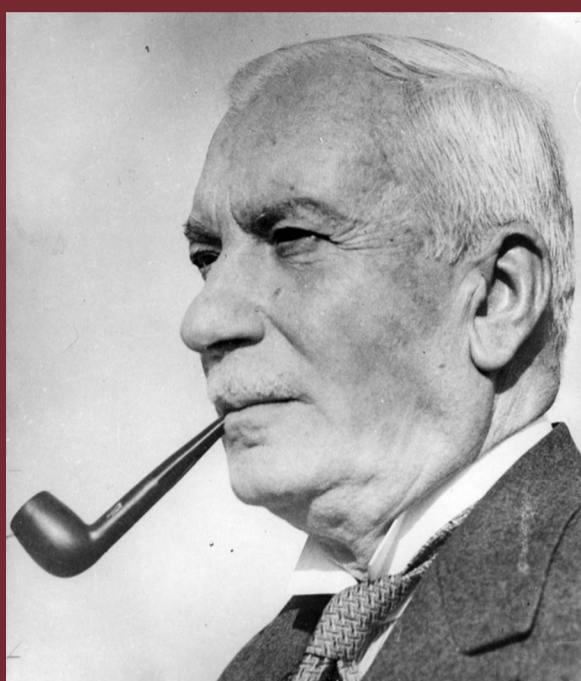

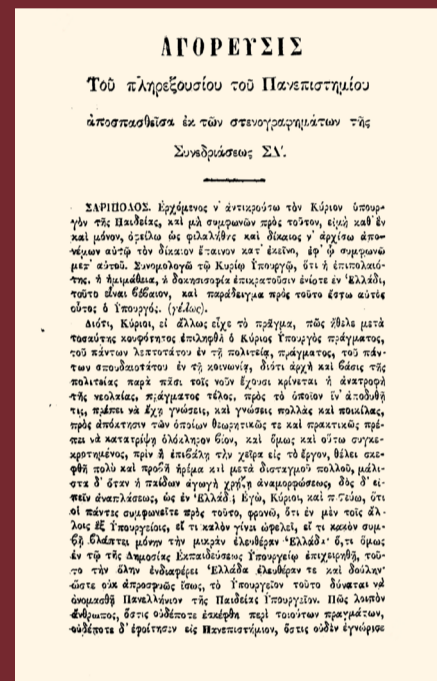

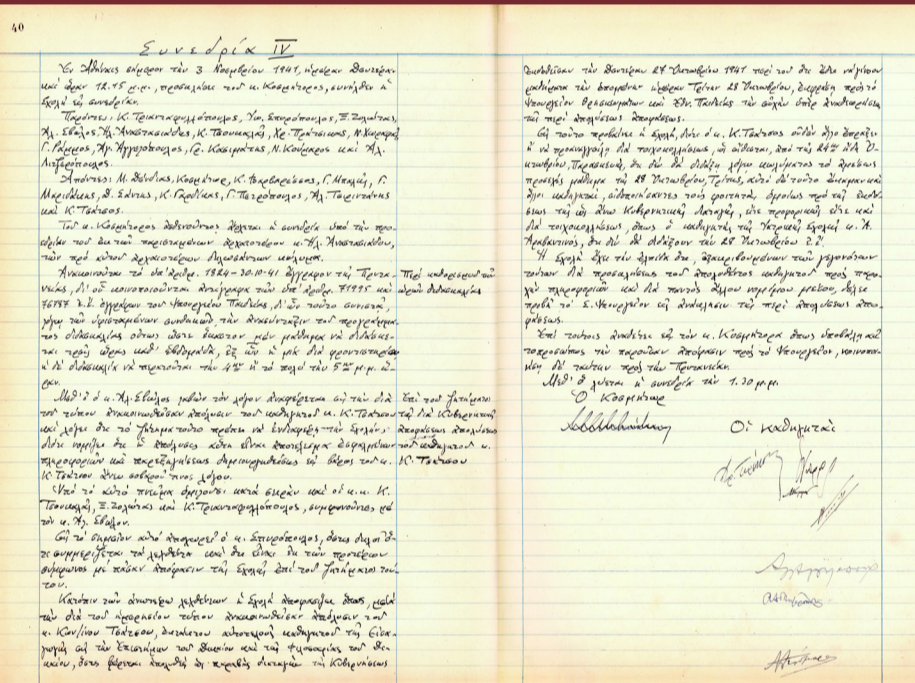

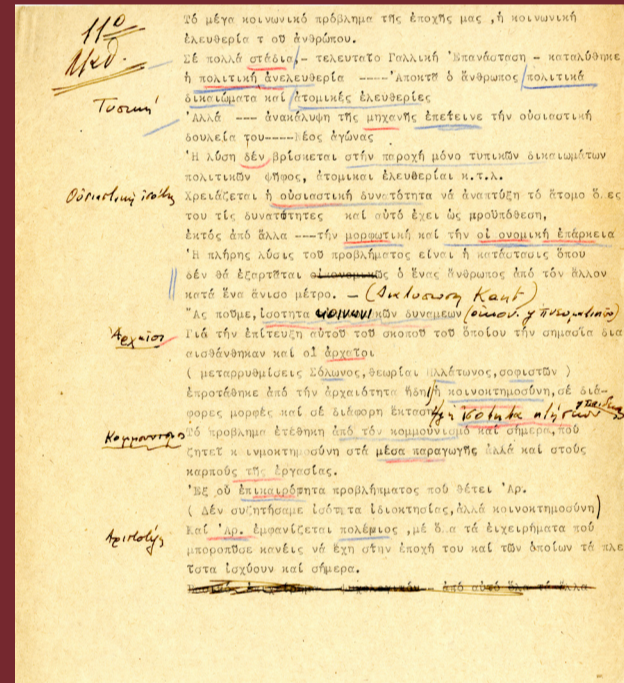

Minutes of the sessions of the 2nd National Assembly



Handwritten extract from the deanship session minutes of the School of Law on 3 November 1941. The document reflects the disagreement of Alexandros Svolos, Konstantinos Tsoukalas, Xenophon Zolotas and Konstantinos Triantaphilopoulos with the decision of the Greek government during the Axis occupation to relieve Konstantinos Tsatsos from his duties. On the first anniversary of October 28th, Konstantinos Tsatsos delivered a speech to his students in favour of freedom, inviting them to lay a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.

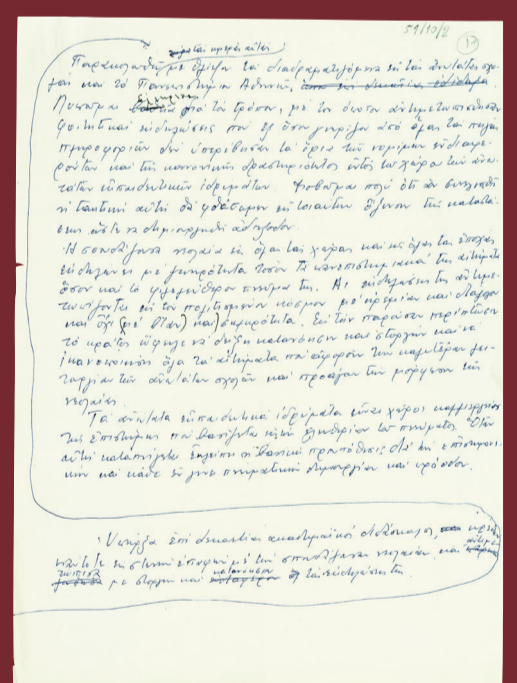

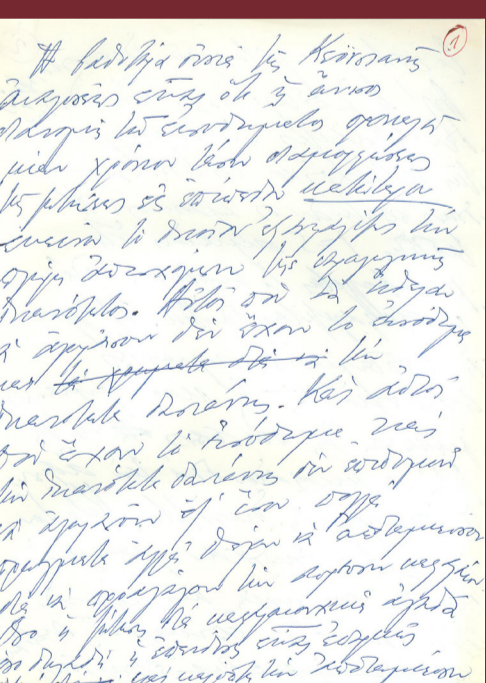


Handwritten note by Xenophon Zolotas, protesting against repressive measures implemented at the University following the revolt of students at the School of Law, 1973

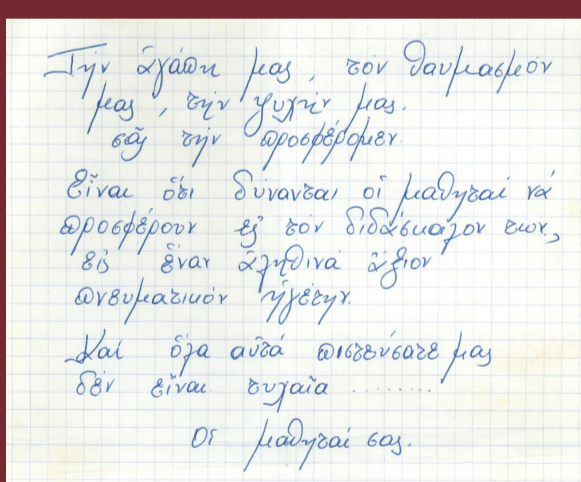

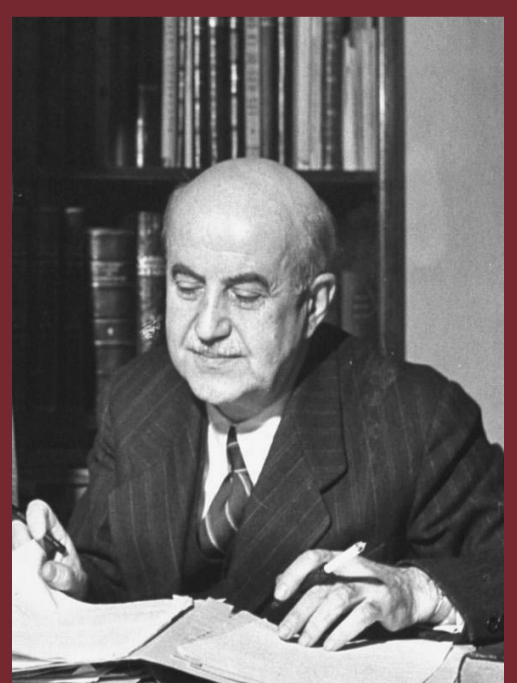
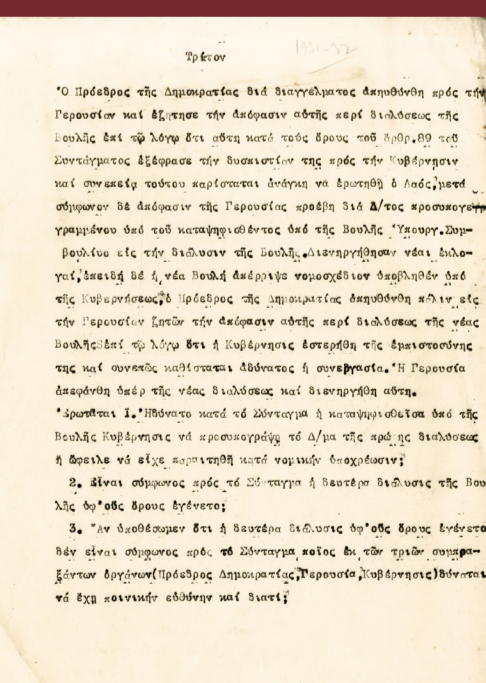


Handwritten note by students addressed to their professor Ioannis Pesmantzoglou, following the announcement of his dismissal by the Military Junta of April 21st

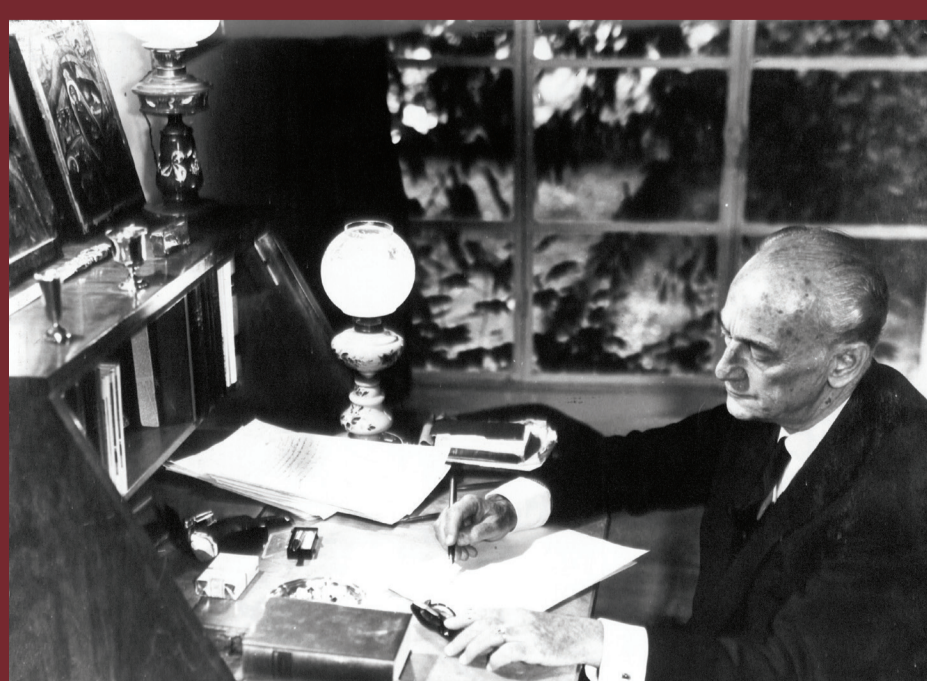
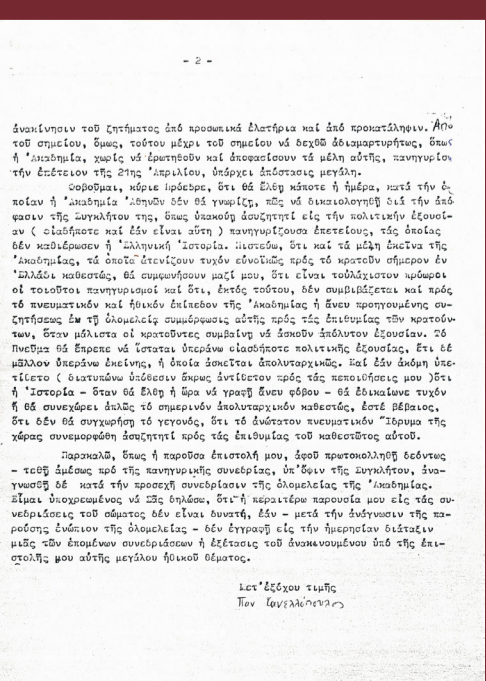
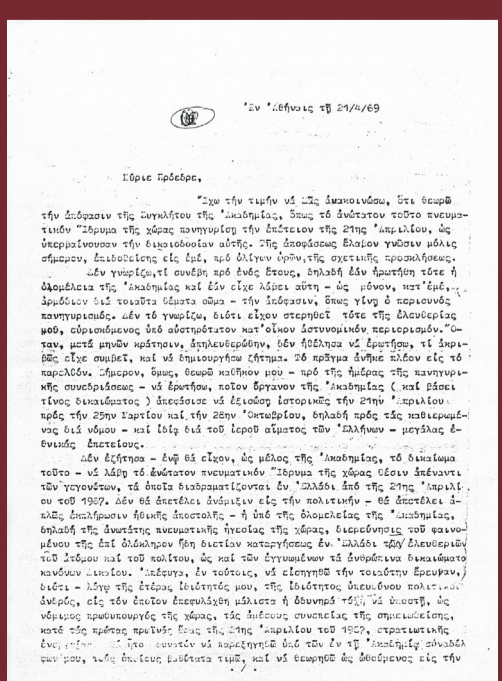
